Beyond an Apple a Day: Providing Consumer Health Information in a Public Library



Course Description

This course is an introduction to locating quality health information on the Internet for consumers. Emphasis is placed on researching symptoms, diagnoses, and treatments of diseases and medical conditions; locating healthcare providers, facilities and services; completing an effective health reference interview; and evaluation of websites for reliability and authoritativeness.

Objectives

Upon completion of this course, Informational Professions will be able to:

- Use MedlinePlus and other National Library of Medicine consumer health databases
- Use Health-E Illinois to identify and locate healthcare providers, facilities and services by type of service, by location within Illinois, and by disease or condition name
- Complete a health reference interview
- Evaluate health web sites with specific criteria
